We embraced the new year with the sweat, tears and sweetness of young artists in their teens and twenties.

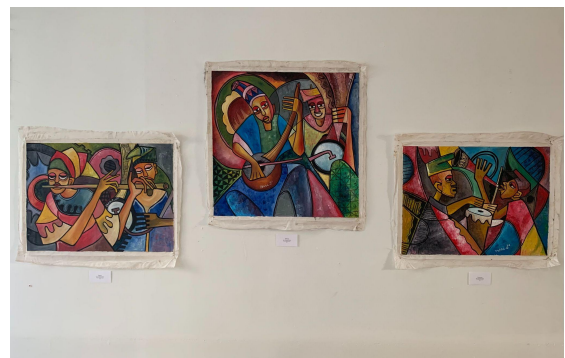
Our fabulous opening reception

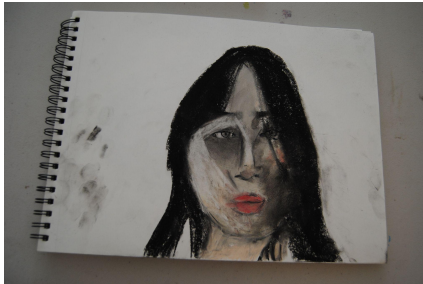


Art workshops for youth

Frank Capezzeria Landscapes

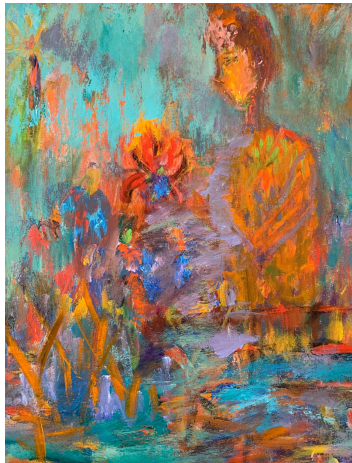
